UKRAINE CRISIS RESPONSE

Update – March 10, 2022

As the crisis in Ukraine enters its third week, Canadian Lutheran World Relief – along with leading Canadian aid agencies in the Humanitarian Coalition – continues its appeal to raise funds and rush emergency assistance to the 2 million refugees who have fled Ukraine and the 4 million who are internally displaced.

CLWR partners in the ACT Alliance are responding in Ukraine and the region to meet immediate humanitarian needs such as food, shelter, emergency supplies and trauma support. Our local partners, including Hungarian Interchurch Aid (HIA), have provided the following support to date:

- Delivery of 278 tons of food and non-food items
- Delivery of \$9.8 million worth of medical equipment
- Establishment of 2 Refugee Support Points – in Barabás, Hungary and Asztely, Ukraine – to provide links to safe transport and food for refugees.
- Establishment of a Child Friendly Space at the Budapest airport as a hub for displaced families to access information and basic necessities.
- Establishment of transitional shelters in Hungary and Ukraine

CLWR joins its partners and millions around the world in calling for an immediate end to violence.

We echo the call from ACT Alliance for all parties to respect humanitarian operations and their humanitarian obligations, to protect all human lives and communities threatened by this violence, and to keep borders open, create safe pathways and provide refuge for those fleeing the conflict.

We call on Canadians to pray for peace, and to give generously in support of the appeal.
